Course

Description

Adolescents who use alcohol and other drugs often experience multiple problems such as academic difficulties, family conflict, poor peer relationships, mental health problems, and involvement with the juvenile justice system. Substance use treatment can help improve adolescent outcomes, but unfortunately only one in 10 teens with a substance use disorder (SUD) will receive any treatment. Maine Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services, in partnership with the New England ATTC, is excited to present a conference designed for treatment providers and health care professionals who are looking to improve the care of adolescents affected by or at risk of substance use disorders.

Objectives

Participants will be able to:

- Describe common symptoms and consequences of substance use disorders (SUDs) and co-occurring mental health disorders in adolescents
- Explain the most common effects of marijuana legalization on adolescents with or at risk of SUDs
- Recognize appropriate strategies to support youth in recovery from SUDs
- Apply at least one evidence-based approach to treating or engaging adolescents with or at risk of SUDs and their families.
